2015 current status includes budget authority and outlays resulting from prior year appropriations. It reflects the latest stage of action, starting with the committee-reported stage.

The Budget Control Act of 2011 (P.L. 112-25) imposes caps on appropriations of new discretionary budget authority. This law allows for adjustments to the discretionary caps (and allows the House Committee on the Budget to adjust the 302(a) allocation for appropriations provided for certain purposes). Funding for overseas contingencies and funding designated as an emergency requirement would lead to an increase in the caps. (Pursuant to section 105 of the Act, in the House of Representatives, funding designated as an emergency requirement shall not count for purposes of title III and IV of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974.) The caps would also be increased for disaster relief funding, but the adjustments would be limited on the basis of historical averages for such funding. In addition, the caps would be increased for program integrity funding, up to the limits provided in the Budget Control Act.

- Pursuant to section 115 of the Bipartisan Budget Act (P.L. 113-67), the House Committee on the Budget published committee allocations in the Congressional Record on April 29, 2014. The House Committee on Appropriations filed 302(b) allocations on May 20, 2014, and updated them on June 17, 2014.
- In accordance with section 3(c)(1) of H. Res. 5 and section 2 of H. Res. 287, amounts designated as an emergency requirement for FY 2015 shall not count for purposes of Sec. 302(b) of the Congressional Budget Act. Therefore, they are excluded from current status and the comparison to the allocation.
- Section 111 of H.R. 5016 would prohibit the Internal Revenue Service from using funds provided in the bill to implement or enforce collection of individual responsibility payments levied under the Affordable Care Act and related reporting requirements. CBO estimates this provision would result in a revenue loss from reduced penalty collections of \$110 million in 2015 and \$115 million in 2016.
- Pursuant to section 251 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985. Disaster funding and program integrity are included in the "general purpose" columns of the table. Emergency requirements are not included in the table (see footnote 2).
