S. 156
Lower Brule Sioux Tribe Infrastructure Development Trust Fund Act
As cleared by the Congress on November 13, 1997

S. 156 would provide compensation to the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe for the taking of reservation lands to build the Fort Randall and Big Bend dam projects. The bill would establish an economic recovery fund for the tribe and make interest from the fund available to the tribe for education, social welfare, and economic development programs.

CBO estimates that enacting S. 156 would create new direct spending authority of \$1.2 million in fiscal year 1999, \$2.5 million in 2000, and \$2.6 million for each of fiscal years 2001 through 2007. We estimate that resulting outlays would total \$5.6 million over the 1999-2002 period and \$18.6 million over the 1999-2007 period.

The following table summarizes the projected changes in direct spending for fiscal years 1998-2007. For purposes of enforcing pay-as-you-go procedures, however, only the effects in the budget year and the succeeding four years are counted.
