H.R. 1067

A bill to make revisions in title 36, United States Code, as necessary to keep the title current and make technical corrections and improvements

As ordered reported by the House Committee on the Judiciary on March 14, 2013

H.R. 1067 would make technical corrections and improvements to the United States Code in title 36, Patriotic and National Observances, Ceremonies, and Organizations. Information from the Office of Law Revision Counsel indicates that the bill would make no substantive changes to the law; therefore, CBO estimates that enacting H.R. 1067 would have no significant impact on the federal budget. Enacting H.R. 1067 would not affect direct spending or revenues; therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures do not apply.

H.R. 1067 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would not affect the budgets of state, local, or tribal governments.
