H.R. 3369 would require the Department of Commerce to study accountability measures for artificial intelligence systems, meet with stakeholders to solicit feedback on such measures, and report its findings. The bill also would direct the department to hold public meetings to solicit feedback about the availability of information on those systems and report on those meetings.

Based on the costs of similar activities, CBO estimates that it would cost \$3 million to implement the requirements in the bill. Any spending would be subject to the availability of appropriated funds.
